School Safety Discussed at In-Service

America Reads Volunteers attended an In-Service on March 27 that featured SAU 29 Associate Superintendent Bill Gurney. Mr. Gurney discussed the revised school safety provisions put in place after the Newtown Tragedy. Mr. Gurney stressed that schools were probably the safest places to be, but as responsible administrators and adults we need to put practices in place that keep our children, faculty and volunteers safe and aware of what actions they need if they are called upon to assist in such an event. The provisions will become a part of the revised America Reads Training program and the information will also be sent to all current volunteers.

Volunteers also discussed the joys and concerns they were experiencing in their work at the schools. Many volunteers are delighted that their students are showing tremendous progress in their reading level and are making large gains every week. An on-going concern at almost all the school is the lack of a specific place to do the volunteer work with the students. They often wind up in the hallway or a makeshift room. Everyone is aware that the school are doing the best job they can to address this need. The end of the year survey was also discussed and will be sent via email or hard copy to all volunteers in mid-May.

Pen Pals visit the Woodward

On March 26th the 4th Grade Class of Ms. Thompson's from Trinity Christian School met with their Pen Pals at the Woodward Residental Home on Court Street in Keene. They Had a great time visiting, dying Easter Eggs in anticipation of the big Easter Egg Roll contest on Sunday, March 31st that is always held at the Woodward. The Pen Pals have been meeting for two years and have become good friends. The letters they exchange are full of family news, jokes, hobbies and news from the school. The residents and students plan to continue friendship next year.

Volunteer Survey Results

Thank you to all the volunteers who completed the Volunteer Survey. We had 90 responses which is a truly phenomenal response rate of 36%. The surveys will enable us to better plan how we move forward with providing more opportunities to volunteers, how we recognize volunteers and what volunteers enjoy doing.

We asked what benefits you would like to have and were quite surprised with the responses. 47% wanted more newsletters, 31% likes educational and in-service opportunities, 27% would like mileage reimbursement, 18% would like discounts at local businesses and 10% liked the traditional recognition luncheons.

Volunteers tend to be very active people—73% volunteer at a place other than there RSVP assignment.

A significant number of you are veterans or have a family member who is a veteran—27%

The two areas that most volunteers want to be involved in are Education (58%) and Disaster Response (29%). The disaster response surprised and we will be working with the Red Cross or build a corp of RSVP volunteers trained and prepared to assist in local and regional disasters.

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

Where are senior citizens in their homes most likely to have accidents?

Kitchen? Bathroom?

According to a list of safety tips released by Comfort Keepers, the staircase is the most dangerous place. Stay safe on the stairs with light sensitive night lights in unlit stairwells, hallways, and by placing light switches at doorways.

Staircase?

KITCHENS

- Use heating elements that shut off such as electric burners on the stove.
- · Keep fire extinguishers handy.
- Only use sturdy step stools with handles and use poles for reaching.
- Keep vents clean of grease.

BATHROOMS

- Modify baths with tub cutaways.
- · Install grab bars.
- Install higher toilets to assist in standing and sitting.
- Apply non-slip strips to bathtubs.
- Use shower seats with back and portable shower heads.
- Paint with contrasting colors.
